




Findings: The overall completion of syllabi in the class appears to be positive, with 33.9% of students rating it as excellent, 32.00% of students rating it as very good, 23.7% of students rating it as good, 7% of students rating it as satisfactory, and 3.5% rating it as unsatisfactory.

Interpretation: The results of the survey indicate that most of the students in the class are satisfied with the completion of syllabi, with the majority rating it as excellent or very good.

Recommendation: Based on the survey results, the completion of syllabi in the class appears to be satisfactory. It would be beneficial, however, to conduct further surveys and analyse the data to determine if any improvements can be made.






Findings: The findings show that the majority of respondents (69.3%) rated the curriculum evaluation points as Excellent or Very Good. 20.9% rated it Good, 6.69% Satisfactory, and 3.3% rated it as Unsatisfactory.

Interpretation: This survey suggests that the majority of respondents are satisfied with the allocation of credits to the course. This indicates that the course is designed in a way that adequately reflects the amount of work required to properly complete it.

Recommendation: Based on the results of this survey, it is recommended that the allocation of credits to the course remain unchanged. This will ensure that the course remains in line with the amount of work required of students and that students remain satisfied with the course.




Findings: This survey shows that the course was well-received by the participants, with 33.8% of respondents rating it as excellent, 33.6% rating it as very good, and 22.4% rating it as good. Only 6.8% of respondents rated the course as satisfactory, and 3.4% rated it as unsatisfactory.

Interpretation: The survey results indicate that the course was generally well-received by participants and that most of them enjoyed the experience.

Recommendation: The high ratings suggest that the course was successful and that similar courses should be organized in the future. The results also suggest that the course should be improved in certain areas, such as increasing the level of satisfaction among those who rated it as satisfactory.


Findings: Based on the response, the majority of respondents found the contents of the syllabus to be easy to learn within the set time period. 32.52% of respondents rated it as excellent, 31.6% of respondents rated it as very good, 19.8% of respondents rated it as good, 9.1% of respondents rated it as satisfactory, and 6.9% of respondents rated it as unsatisfactory.

Interpretation: Overall, the majority of respondents found the contents of the syllabus to be easy to learn within the set time period.

Recommendation: Based on the survey results, the syllabus should be maintained as-is. However, further efforts should be made to improve the resources available to students, such as providing additional study materials and offering additional support services to help struggling students. Additionally, the syllabus should be periodically reviewed to ensure that it is up-to-date and relevant to current trends in the field.




Findings: The findings from the survey indicate that most respondents thought that the units in the syllabus were properly sequenced. 36.2% of respondents rated the syllabus as excellent, 33.1% rated it as very good, 21.5% rated it as good, 5.6% rated it as satisfactory and 3.6% rated it as unsatisfactory.

Interpretation: The majority of respondents found the units in the syllabus to be properly sequenced, with only a small percentage rating the syllabus as unsatisfactory. This indicates that the syllabus is generally well-structured and easily understood by students.

Recommendation: Based on the results of the survey, it is recommended that the syllabus be maintained in its current form. If there are any modifications to be made, they should be minor in nature and take into account the feedback received from students.


Findings: The majority of the respondents rated the objectives/learning outcomes for each part of the course as either excellent or very good. 33% of the respondents rated them as excellent, 32.7% rated them as very good, 25.1% rated them as good, 5.7% rated them as satisfactory and 3.6% rated them as unsatisfactory.

Interpretation: The results indicate that the objectives/learning outcomes for each part of the course were clear, precise and specific.

Recommendation: The objectives/learning outcomes should be maintained at the same level of quality in order to ensure that students have a clear understanding of what they are expected to learn.




Findings: The findings indicate that the majority of students (65.8%) have rated the instructional materials used in the course as either Excellent or Very Good. A smaller proportion (29%) has rated the materials as Good or Satisfactory, and a very small proportion (5.2%) have rated them as Unsatisfactory.

Interpretation: The results of the survey suggest that the instructional materials used in the course have been generally well received by the students, with the majority of them finding them to be of a high quality.




Findings: The results of the tests, assignments, and projects show that the majority of students have achieved excellent (38.8%) and very good (32.00%) learning outcomes. 20.5% achieved good outcomes, 4.5% achieved satisfactory outcomes, and 4.2% achieved unsatisfactory outcomes.

Interpretation: The majority of students have demonstrated a high level of attainment of the learning outcomes.

Recommendation: The tests, assignments, and projects should be kept in place as they have been successful in measuring student learning outcomes. Continuing to monitor and assess student learning outcomes is important to ensure that students are meeting their learning objectives.




Findings: Based on the survey results, the open elective syllabus appears to be mostly positively received. 33.1% of respondents rated the syllabus as excellent, 32.7% rated it as very good, 20.6% rated it as good, 6.90% rated it as satisfactory, and 6.7% rated it as unsatisfactory.

Interpretation: The majority of respondents rated the open elective syllabus positively, indicating that they feel it is relevant.

Recommendation: The open elective syllabus should be maintained, as it appears to be meeting the needs of the majority of respondents. However, further consideration should be given to improving the syllabus to better meet the needs of those who rated it as unsatisfactory.

Findings: The majority of students (65.5%) have an excellent or very good scope for acquiring employability and entrepreneurship skills through curriculum. 20.9% of students have a good scope and 13.6% of students have a satisfactory or unsatisfactory scope.

Interpretation: The findings suggest that the majority of students have access to a good level of curriculum-based employability and entrepreneurship skills, however there is still a significant number of students with a lower level of access.

Recommendation: It is recommended that the University should look into ways of improving the curriculum to ensure that all students have access to the same level of employability and entrepreneurship skills. This could include introducing more activities and workshops to teach these skills, or providing additional resources and materials to help students learn.


TEACHERS' FEEDBACK 2021-22

Teachers' feedback is an important parameter for quality improvement of the curriculum and the quality of the student of institution. 




Findings: The findings of the survey show that a majority of the respondents (87.5%) rated the syllabus of the course as excellent or very good.

Objectives of the Curriculum are well defined and clear to teachers and students 40 responses



The curriculum has good balance between theory and application 40 responses




Findings: Based on the data provided, it can be seen that the majority of the respondents (80%) think that the curriculum has a good balance between theory and application, with 22.5% giving it an excellent rating and 57.5% giving it a very good rating. 12.5% of the respondents indicated that the balance was good, while 2.5% of the respondents indicated that it was satisfactory. Lastly, only 5% of the respondents indicated that the balance was unsatisfactory.

The Books prescribed/listed as reference material in curriculum are relevant and appropriate 40 responses



Sufficient number of prescribed books are available in the Library 40 responses







The course/syllabus has made me interested in the subject area 40 responses



The course/syllabus of this subject increased my knowledge and perspective in the subject area. 40 responses















Aims and objectives of the syllabus were well defined and clear to the teachers and students. responses



The course/ syllabus increased my knowledge and understanding of the subject studied. responses







The syllabus was directly related to enhancing practical competencies. responses





8. The syllabus was need based as per the requirement of the job/industry.





Sufficient number of co-curricular activities were arranged during my study period responses



The interpretation of the data suggests that the institute is successfully providing enough opportunities for extracurricular activities, as most students are satisfied with the offerings.







Recommendation: The teacher should make sure that the remaining 2.9% of the students should also understand the subject by providing additional help or resources.





The students are able to work as part of the team 35 responses



The students maintain cordial relation with peers and seniors responses







Students have the required managerial / leadership qualities responses



Students volunteer to get into new initiatives taken up by the industry / Firm 35 responses



Students contribute substantially to the growth of the industry / Firm responses






25.7% of the students have rated them as good, while only 5.8% of the students have rated them as either satisfactory or unsatisfactory.
